Things To Keep In Mind:

* As you do your online shopping, PLEASE keep in mind that not all packaging materials are recyclable. Mail carrier packages that are lined with bubble wrap or padded with polystyrene are UNABLE to be separated and processed at the recycling center.



- * As a reminder, LOOSE plastic bags are not accepted in curbside recycling. They gum up the sorting equipment. Plastic bags and film MAY be placed in your recycling blue bin ONLY if clean, dry and tied in a clear plastic bag. The better option is TRY to eliminate PLASTIC as much as possible.
- * SB 1383 Information: As a reminder, BVR&R staff will be lifting container lids and visually examining the contents. This is a requirement of SB 1383 and an opportunity for us to engage and educate the community in better sorting techniques.
